- Viewing the award-winning film on moths by a Finnish producer, in collaboration with the Finnish Science Center Heureka. Heureka will arrange special sessions to show the film to ICE2022Helsinki participants several times during the week, in their fulldome theatre. A guided visit will be organized on Thursday 21.7.2022. Heureka is 15 min train-ride from the center of Helsinki, covered by the free travelcard provided to all ICE2022Helsinki participants.  - Introductory presentation by Dr. Stephen Venn on Monday at lunchtime
 - Guided walk at lunchtime on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday

 - Prof. Jarmo Holopainen: Plants can communicate - how do insects respond?
 - Prof. Heikki Hokkanen: The endangered Flying squirrel (*Pteromys volans*) in Finland

The secret world of moths



Documentary film, 24 min, 4K fulldome, 2016

The Secret World of Moths is an upbeat adventure into the world of moths. The film traverses from the equator to the Arctic Circle with different moth species. These two extreme environments help us comprehend the diversity and fragility of life, and its capacity for renewal.

The film makes use of 3D X-ray tomography to explore insects at a microscopic level.

The film will be shown to the ICE2022Helsinki registered participants and accompanying persons at the Finnish Science Center HEUREKA. For Accompanying Persons a special showing is arranged on Thursday 21 July with a guided travel to Heureka.

Guided, joint departure will leave from Messukeskus main entrance (time to be announced). HEUREKA is located a short train ride (15-20 minutes) north from the central railway station. See: <https://www.myhelsinki.fi/en/see-and-do/sights/heureka-the-finnish-science-centre>
